4) The Board Preparatory Floor-

• My experience for Board examination-

Therefore, it is essential for teachers to view parents as an important part of an inclusive classroom. Teachers can make parents feel welcome and valued through class newsletters, volunteering communication books or home work planners as well as giving regular feedback. Establishing a welcoming and respectful environment in the classroom for parents will support teachers' efforts to become more inclusive in numerous ways.

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
